

# TRANSPHOBE MSM 'DEADNAMES' NASHVILLE SHOOTER

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'Misgendering' transgender people is the ultimate crime in mainstream reporting. Except when they shoot up a Christian school, of course.

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Clad in a bulletproof vest and packing two 'assault-style' rifles, a 28-year-old stormed a Christian school in Nashville, Tennessee on Monday, March 27th, killing six people in the process, before being shot by the police. Even though the shooter went by the name of Aiden and used he/him pronouns, legacy media keeps referring to her as Audrey Hale.

Just to be clear, when discussing horrible tragedies such as school shootings, having to worry about appropriate pronouns in an effort not to insult the late perpetrator's gender identity would be an absurd request at best. Yet, *USA Today* still managed to find time to correct any errors that may have occurred in their initial reporting of the attack, saying that it was the officials who originally 'misgendered' the shooter, a biological female who identified as a trans man.

But not all mainstream media outlets were so sensible. A quick look around at their reporting, including [CNN's](#), [NBC's](#), and [The New York Times'](#), reveals that all recognized that the shooter was a female-to-male transgender individual, but still repeatedly used the shooter's old, 'dead' name: Audrey Hale.

We all know perfectly well how serious a crime 'misgendering' is nowadays, precisely because legacy media keeps [reminding](#) us. So, how come, in this tragic circumstance, has it failed in its role as an ally for transgender people all of a sudden? I suspect the answer has something to do with this particular person being a mass murderer.

The evidence I sketch out above perfectly spells out the victim hierarchy of this twisted woke worldview. By deciding to use the shooter's original name, mainstream media outlets basically admitted that they would rather have a woman portrayed in bad light than have a
